The first lecture was held on May 14 at the prestigious Institute of Oriental Studies of the Russian Academy of Sciences. Prof. Michael Shi-yung Liu of the Institute of Taiwan History at Academia Sinica presented a speech entitled "Digital Resources and Taiwan Studies" at the seminar.

Two days later on May 16, the second one was held in Leipzig University and Prof. Liu gave a lecture on the topic "The Study of the Taiwan History of Medicine and Digital Resources: A Case Study of the 1939 Film 'Malaria."
