■ NCL Receives a Donation of Letters and Writings Belonging to the Late Historians

Ms. Binbin Chin, the daughter of famous late historian, Professor Chung-shu Chin, and widow of Professor Kenneth Pei-hsiung Ho, a late Hong Kong renowned sinologist, donated to NCL the lifetime collection her father's letters and documents, a total of 41 items for permanent keeping. She also gave the copyright of the two professors' fifteen scholarly works for digitization so that more people can benefit from their works.

The late Professor Chin graduated from the Hong Kong New Asia College. He was a student of Mr. Qian Mu and a famous Song history expert. The late Professor Ho was a doctorate graduate from Oxford University and has been a professor in the Chinese department at the Hong Kong Chinese University. His research specializations were on Western Chinese Studies, Confucianism, humorous essay style of Han Wei and Six Dynasties and other related areas.

To thank Ms. Chin for her generous donation and to pay tribute to the two professors, the NCL held a donation ceremony on March 11. A good number of the two Professors' former students in Taiwan, about 30 of them, were present. They shared

many anecdotes about the two professors and their scholarly attitudes in imparting knowledge. The atmosphere was heartwarming, touching the hearts of everyone. They all confirmed and commended the excellent work of NCL in data collection management as well as digitization and other related areas.

In her speech, Director General Tseng pointed out that the 29 letters from the collection of Professor Chung-shu Chin are documents from important political figures in contact with him. They are therefore very precious and significant historical materials. The NCL will carefully preserve them as a heritage.

■ NCL Participates in the AAS Annual Meeting and Book Fair
