## ■ EACS 21st Biennial Meeting

The European Association for Chinese Studies (EACS) holds a large-scale association meeting every two years. This year, their 21st biennial meeting took place in August at St. Petersburg State University in Russia. Nearly 600 sinologists from around the world were in attendance.

The NCL and the Center for Chinese Studies (CCS) teamed up with the Chiang Ching-kuo Foundation for International Scholarly Exchange to put on a book exhibition at the meeting, showcasing new research and publications from Taiwan.

On display were 234 titles (253 volumes), representing the best of publications from the last three years. After the biennial meeting, a donation ceremony was held on Aug. 27 to present the books to the sponsoring institution, St. Petersburg State University. The university secretary Aleksey A. Zavarzin received the donation on behalf of the university.

The NCL has a new version of its Chinese-language guide this year, which discusses its aims, strategies, service facilities, and other new information.




## ■ A Catalog of Ancient Books Related to Mongolia
