

## ■ Special Exhibition on “The Mother of Cities: Prague” Opens

The Czech Economic and Cultural Office and NCL cohosted a special exhibition on “The Mother of Cities: Prague” from March 14 to April 26. The opening ceremony was held on the first day of the exhibition and was hosted by Representative Václav Jílek. Deputy Minister Chi-chung Wu (吳志中) from Ministry of Foreign Affairs, Deputy Minister Tzu-bao Yang (楊子葆) from the Ministry of Culture, and Ms. Anna Maria Madeleine Majorenko from the European Economic and Trade Office were in attendance.


