add to its valuable collection.

After the ceremony had concluded, Director-General Tseng took the opportunity to visit the library. She took a keen interest in DNB's policies towards digitization and the preservation and storage of its special collection. In particular, Director-General Tseng was deeply impressed by The German Exile Archive and the preservation of immigrant records held in the library's special collection. The DNB also arranged for Ms. Tseng to meet with Sabine Schrimpf, an expert from its Information Science Department. They shared their valuable knowledge and experience of working with IBM on digital preservation projects and remote backup mechanisms.

The NCL and the Library of the Hungarian Academy of Sciences Partner to Establish Hungary's First TRCCS

On May 17, Director-General Tseng of the NCL and Director-General István Monok of the Library and Information Center of the Hungarian Academy of Sciences, signed an agreement to establish a Taiwan Resource Center for Chinese Studies (TRCCS). A ceremony was held to unveil the sign for the TRCCS, which is the first to be established in Hungary, and the 23th worldwide.

The Hungarian Academy of Sciences is Hungary's most important research institution. The Oriental Library, now known as the Oriental Collection, was once subordinate to the Oriental Research Center. It houses a collection of Tibetan, Turkic and Hebrew manuscripts of world importance that are an important oriental studies and sinology research resource.

In 2016, the NCL and Hungarian Academy of Sciences previously signed a MOU relating to the Union Catalogue of Chinese Rare Books database. Besides donating a collection of Chinese studies and Taiwan studies related books to the library, the new cooperation also provides access to digital resources such as NCL's digital archives and electronic databases.
