## **News from Taiwan Libraries**

### ■ **Unrestricted eBook Lending: Special Version for Kaohsiung City’s Visually-Impaired**

Kaohsiung (高雄) Public Library has set up a Taiwan Cloud Library e-book lending platform for Kaohsiung residents. Within it, the library has created a special “Unrestricted Access Area” that visually-impaired readers can use with screen reader software on their computer to give them 24-hour access to e-books from home.

### ■ **Taichung Public Library Unveils the “New Residents Love Reading: Multicultural Book Area”**

The Huludun (葫蘆墩) branch of the Taichung (台中) Public Library has set up a “New Residents Love Reading: Multicultural Book Area.” The section is stocked with books written in six south-east Asian languages. Its aim is to help new immigrants from the region to keep in contact with their cultures and encourage them to read with their children.
