A New Prototype System for Taiwan Memory

On July 31, 2017, the National Central Library (NCL) held an announcement campaign, building a new prototype system for Taiwan Memory, which was a cooperative project between the NCL and Research Center for Digital Humanities of National Taiwan University (臺灣大學).

NCL Director-General Shu-hsien Tseng (曾淑 賢) explained that Taiwan Memory was a website that gathered together digital resources, and was popular both among literature and history scholars and in the publishing industry. The Ministry of Education's 2016 digital humanities plan incorporated the idea of providing the ability to explore digital humanities resources into historical materials databases.
