■ The 2017 National Day Reception

The 2017 National Day reception was held at Taipei Guesthouse, as is customary. The National Central Library (NCL) made special arrangements to have CCS's recipients of the Research Grant for Foreign Scholars in Chinese Studies, the Ministry of Foreign Affairs' recipients of the Taiwan Fellowship and their spouses to attend. A total of 42 scholars and their spouses from 29 countries were in attendance.

This year's National Day theme was "2017: Better Together." Displays put together by Taiwan's world renowned floral designers decorated the entrance of the reception. A layered effect resembling a firework display symbolized the rising strength of the nation. A bedding of moon orchids, a butterfly orchid indigenous to Taiwan, where it is affectionately known as "Taiwanese Grandma," symbolized the idea of Taiwanese roots advancing into the world to create a better Taiwan in 2017.

More than 4,000 guests from Taiwan and overseas enjoyed musical and theatrical performances together. These were given by groups including the National Taiwan College of Performing Arts, who tour extensively around the world performing, and seasoned performers the 25 Degrees Orchestra. The performances were an audio-visual feast that mingled native, innovative, and diverse elements, creating a joyful atmosphere in which the guests celebrated National Day.

■ Pingtung County Government Renovates Its Main Library

To provide a better reading space, the Pingtung (屏東) County government is renovating its main library. The main building will incorporate indigenous totems, and establish special children's, teenage, senior citizen, multicultural, and Pingtung literature areas. The estimated completion date is October 2018

■ Taichung to Build Taiwan's First National Manga Museum
