event to invite Steve Antony (Feb 10) and Yannets Levi (Feb 11) to come to NCL to speak.

Steve Antony, whose Mr. Panda series has become a bestseller worldwide, was awarded Britain's Oscar's Book Prize in 2014 for the first time for his book *The Queen's Hat*. He was also a finalist in England's Waterstones Children's Book Prize. His book *Please, Mr. Panda* was selected as the Best Children's Book by the Society of Illustrators in New York. His lecture at NCL was filled with humor and wit as he spoke about his creative content and his passion for illustrated books. He even drew interesting pictures during his talk. His interaction with the audience brought the lecture to an exciting climax.

Mr. Yannets Levi is one of the most popular authors for adults and children in Israel. He has published nine bestselling books. He spoke on his experience creating *Uncle Leo's Adventures* and *When Grandpa Jonah Was Just a Kid*, stating that in writing children's books one can take two people or things that seem unrelated and bring them together. In doing so he reevaluates experiences and thinks more deeply as he pieces stories together. In addition, creative works do not have a set method. He hopes that his stories can be published in different media and platforms.

In an effort to raise the global visibility of Taiwan's outstanding libraries, to inspire morale in public library staffs, and to increase head librarians, supervisors, and outstanding librarians' understanding of international library developments, in 2017 National Central Library (NCL) with the support of the Ministry of Education arranged for two delegations to travel to the U.S. and Canada (Sep 23-30) and Singapore (Dec 3-8) to tour and learn from public libraries there.

After the visits, on January 1, 2018 NCL held an Outcomes Conference on Taiwan Public Library Delegations to the U.S., Canada, and Singapore. Delegates were invited to share what they learned, with the hope that it would be a useful reference
