News from Taiwan Libraries

Tamkang, Soochow and Ming Chuan Universities Pilot Taiwan's First Private University Interlibrary System

On March 27, 2019, Tamkang, Soochow and Ming Chuan Universities announced the creation of the first interlibrary resource-sharing system for Taiwan's private universities. In future, students of the three universities will be able to borrow books from any of the three university libraries. If the pilot is successful, it will be extended to include all twelve private university libraries in the Excellent Long-Established University Consortium of Taiwan (ELECT).

Tamkang University established the ELECT Library Automation Planning Center in February 2019, with Prof. Sheue-fang Song of Tamkang University, as convener of the automation workgroup. Tamkang, Soochow, and Ming Chuan Universities purchased a library automation system from overseas, and began a pilot to integrate and share the resources of the three university libraries with each other. These resources will be made accessible to the staff and students of the three universities to borrow and read

New Hsinchu Main Library Will Open in Late 2022

Preparations are underway for construction of the new Hsinchu Main Library. In February 2019, the Ministry of Education approved NT\$400 million in funding for the project, which will be matched by Hsinchu City Government. The brand

new main library will be constructed on the original site of the Library of the Cultural Affairs Bureau, and is due to open at the end of 2022. The new library will be three times larger than the current building, ample for Hsinchu residents' study, arts, and leisure needs. The plan for the Hsinchu Main Library's construction details the desig of the buildings and its environs, while also aiming to strengthen library services so that they can respond to future information and education development trends. The library will combine Hsinchu's special qualities as a city of technology and the humanities. A STEAM-oriented maker base will be built within the library itself, and a combination of hardware and software used to help create a more intimate learning space, which help foster a new generation of emerging talent and boost the city's competitiveness.
