preparations for the construction of the Southern Branch of the National Central Library and National Repository Library. The forum was jointly hosted by the National Central Library (NCL), Bioarchitecture Formosana (BAF), National Chiao Tung University (NCTU), and Taiwan Architecture & Building Center (TABC).

NCL Director-General Shu-hsien Tseng opened the forum with a short speech, in which she remarked that the NCL had fought for more than 15 years to secure the construction of the Southern Branch of the National Central Library. The NCL finally won Executive Yuan approval for the project in late December, 2017, and awarded the tender to design and oversee the construction to BAF the following year. The Beitou Branch of Taipei Public Library, constructed in partnership with BAF while DG Tseng was director-general of Taipei Public Library, had changed everyone's definition of a library, won many awards and become very well known around the world. The NCL is partnering with BAF and Carlo Ratti Associates for this project, with the aim of bringing even more innovative design elements and concepts.

The topics presented for discussion at the forum included a lecture by Prof. June-hao Hou, Director of NCTU Graduate Institute of Architecture, entitled "From Keeper to Explorer," and a lecture by the renowned Italian architect Prof. Carlo Ratti of MIT Senseable City Lab, entitled "The Senseable City." By analyzing statistical data on building use, we can better understand people's behavior in specific spaces and how to influence their creativity. With regard to future trends, Prof. Ratti believed that when designing libraries of the future we ought to strengthen new connections between people, books, and nature.

The event concluded with the forum discussion, which was attended by Prof. June-hao Hou, Prof. Carlo Ratti, Dr. Ming-whei Feng of the Institute for Information Industry, Mr. Kun-yue Lin of Delta Electronics Inc., Mr. Jhen-bo Tan of Siemens, and Mr. Chin-wei Lee of Bio-architecture Formosana.

This report uses the Taiwan Citation Index for Humanities and Social Sciences (TCI-HSS) to produce statistics on journal citations over the last 30 years in each subject area, and also to calculate the five-year journal impact factor for 2017. These two statistics are respectively used to observe the long term impact of the dissemination of humanities and social science research, and the possible immediate to short-term impact of its publication. This report also lists the total number of core journals published by each university, and summarizes and ranks the total numbers of citations of each type of university academic publication.


## NCL International Exchange Events
