## **2007 IASL Annual Conference**

The 36th Annual Conference of the International Association of School Librarianship (IASL) was held on July 16-20, 2007, at National Taiwan Normal University (NTNU), attracting over 500 participants from 31 countries.

This year's conference theme was Cyberspace, D-world, E-learning: Giving Libraries and Schools the Cutting Edge. Three keynote speeches were presented during the conference. OCLC President and CEO Jay Jordan spoke on "Digital Libraries and e-Learning"; Dr. Ken Haycock of San Jose State University's School of Library and Information Science spoke San Jose State University addressed the topic of "New Emerging Information and Communication

Technologies"; and Dr. Wu Mei-mei of the Graduate Institute of Library and Information Studies at NTNU spoke on the topic "About Teachers' Personal Knowledge Management and the Use of Global Digital Learning Objects Repositories." The conference also focused on the five major topics of New Communication Technologies and School Libraries, Collaborative Teaching and School Libraries, e-Learning and School Libraries, Interaction between the Digital Library and e-Learning, and New Reading Behavior and Information Literacy for Teachers and Students.
