The IASL provides an international forum for those people interested in promoting effective school library media programs as viable instruments in the educational process. It currently comprises over 80 member countries.

A total of 15 personnel from the NCL took part in the conference as well to promote specialized and culture exchanges with their counterparts in other countries. Five NCL staff members also assisted with the conference registration on the open day of July 17.

The conference gave participants a chance to learn more about the operations and services of various types of libraries in the Taiwan area. Participants were invited on library tours, and 23 conference attendees visited the NCL on July 19. ■ **NTU's Jieh Hsiang Tapped as OCLC Asia-Pacific Representative**

National Taiwan University (NTU) Library Director Jieh Hsiang was elected on June 26 as the Asia-Pacific regional service provider for the Members council of the OCLC (Online Computer Library Center), positioning him to promote library information and experience sharing between Taiwan

and the international community.

Founded in 1967, the OCLC is a nonprofit organization dedicated to the public purposes of furthering access to the world's information and reducing information costs. More than 57,000 libraries in 112 countries and territories around the world use OCLC services to locate, acquire, catalog, lend and preserve library materials.

At present, 202 university, public and specialized libraries in Taiwan are members of OCLC, giving them access to the organization's WorldCat-the biggest online union catalog in the world-and other valuable resources. NTU, which originally promoted Taiwan's membership in the organization, is in charge of organizing OCLC-related meetings in Taiwan.

OCLC Members Council delegates are elected for three-year terms by the members of their respective regions. Six Asia-Pacific members were nominated for regional service provider position, including members from Singapore, Taiwan, Australia, and China. Director Hsiang won the election with 171 votes, indicating the strong support Taiwan enjoys among the OCLC members. (Chinese text excerpted from the Central News Agency, July 3, 2007)

The 5th Annual Library Leadership Institute was held at the Xiamen National Accounting Institute Restaurant in mainland China from May 11 to 15, 2007. Ms. Wang Ming-ling and Mr. Chen Te-han of the National Central Library (NCL) participated in the event, which was organized by the University of Hong Kong Libraries (HKUL) in conjunction with Xiamen University Library.

The primary objectives of the institute were: 1) To develop and enhance management and leadership qualities in academic and research librarians in the East Asia region, and 2) To enhance collaboration and foster relations among academic and research libraries in the region. Courses focused on information technology and management science, including introductions to information systems from third-party providers.

The principal facilitator was Mr. Marshall Breeding, Director for Innovative Technologies and Research, Vanderbilt University Library, and developer of the highly respected Vanderbilt Television News Archive.
