(Würzburg Public Library), shared her experience in managing public libraries in a keynote speech on "Doing Right in the Right Way: Success Strategies for Public Libraries."

Dr. Vogt described how libraries can reposition and win back readers, drawing on the example of the Stadtbücherei Würzburg, which has won multiple awards, including Germany's 2003 Library Award. She emphasized the importance of staff enthusiasm and initiative in moving libraries forward. Libraries should design reader-oriented activities and place the operational focus on readers and library personnel. Dr. Vogt also introduced activities at her library to promote reading and education, approaches to building a good image, network establishment, cooperation with different types of partners and educational institutions, and activities aimed at different age groups.

■ AIT Inaugurates "American Shelf" in Kaohsiung

The Kaohsiung Branch of the American Institute in Taiwan (AIT) unveiled an "American Shelf" at the Baochu Branch of the Kaohsiung Public Library. Director Stephen M. Young of AIT Kaohsiung, Vice Mayor Chiu Tai-shan, and Kaohsiung Public Library Director Shih Chun-fu jointly presided at the opening ceremony.

The Shelf introduces users to American society and culture via its collection of books, pamphlets, and DVDs covering topics on American culture and society, American history, and travel to the USA, and through various speaker and cultural activities. Additionally, it features an online student advising program, which connects students in Kaohsiung with advisors in Taipei who can answer questions about study in the U.S.
