

■ *Ho Huikuang Photo Exhibition*

The NCL Arts and Audiovisual Center held “Ho Huikuang Photo Exhibition” on November 30, 2009, to January 31, 2010. It reflected the early days of Taiwan life. 79 photos showed the rural life in Taiwan in the 1970’s and 27 antique cameras were presented at the exhibition. The brands of the camera include: Leica, Nikon, Zeiss, Rollei Cord, Rollei Flex, Konishiroku (Konica), Kodak, Voigtlander, Pentocon, and Kochmann. The Konishiroku (Konica) camera is the first 128 camera in Japan. The Kodak camera is the world’s first film camera. Mr. Ho also generously donated two antique cameras, Rollei Flex and Super Ikonta BX, to the NCL permanent collection.
