■ *Visit to Xiamen University, University library and Xiamen city library*

From 18 to 21 March, Director I-Jung Lee, Asst. Editor Li-Ling Chen, and Senior editor Li-Jen Ku accompanied the President and a number of professors of National Taipei University on a trip to Xiamen University, the University library, and the Xiamen city library.

The city of Xiamen lies on the coast of Fujian Province. As a coastal city, it made contact with the West earlier than other areas, and as a result has progressed quickly, becoming a youthful and vibrant city. The academic and research environment at Xiamen University is excellent, and the university library has abundant resources. The architecture is striking, the equipment complete, and the utilization rate is high; the Zhangzhou campus branch is also extremely well-managed. The collection of the Zhongshan branch of the Gulangyu Xiamen city library bears a strong local character, and is geared towards the needs of the local population. The Xiamen city library is a municipal library integrated with the city's cultural center. The library building was designed by an American architect, and reworks an industrial site to yield an open, spacious interior. The reading environment is pleasant, with a garden reading area that readers pass through. The Xiamen University library will continue to conduct exchanges with NCL.

Creation Publishing Company. At the same time, a number of exhibits were made: “The Literature of Profs. I-Wen Chung and Da-Wei Chen”; “The Modern Literature in NCL”; and “Original Books from Southeast Asia in the NCL Collection.”

In order to conform to policies promoting cultural diversity in education, NCL will be offering publications of Southeast Asian literary classics and representative works, in service of the new immigrant population. Furthermore, NCL will establish cooperative relationships with Malaysia, Thailand, Singapore, and Vietnam, so as to expand and broaden exchange of publications and actualize the goals of international cultural and educational exchange.

■ *Volunteer Service Award and Guide Training Completion Ceremonies*

In order to award NCL volunteers for their devoted service, the Ministry of the Interior established the “Volunteer Service Award Regulations”, which award for volunteers who have completed over 3000 hours of volunteer service are eligible. In 2009, the first NCL applicants qualified for the award, and it was conferred on twelve volunteers, all of whom had at least four years of seniority, and many of whom volunteered every day, Monday through Friday.
