■ NCL Hosts 2010 Zhejiang Book Exhibition

The Third Zhejiang Book Exhibition was held at National Central Library (NCL) on June 11 to 13. The event was jointly organized by the NCL, Publishers' Association of the Republic of China, Zhejiang Provincial Publishing Association, and Zhejiang Publishing United Group through close communication and planning between the two sides. The joint effort provides a good model for future cross-strait interaction in the publishing sector.

The opening ceremony and book donation ceremony were held on the morning of June 11,

presided by NCL Director-general Karl Min Ku. The VIP guest list included Deputy Director Fan Chunmei of the Administration of Press and Publication Bureau (Copyright Bureau) of Zhejiang Province, Publishers' Association of the Republic of China President Chen En-chuan, and other publishing industry insiders.

At the book donation ceremony, Deputy Director Fan presented to the NCL over 5,000 high-quality books published in Zhejiang over the past decade, including works on economy, society, culture, and travel, as well as illustrated children's books and other works on history and philosophy. Director-general Ku presented an appreciation plaque in gratitude of the gift.

Zhejiang is a province with a rich literary tradition. The books donated by the Zhejiang Publishing United Group included many high quality publications with great academic reference value, such as The Collected Works of Wang Guowei. Contemporary illustrated children's books, a genre in which Zhejiang plays a pivotal role in mainland China, were another highlight of the exhibition, offering Taiwan readers a rare chance to appreciate these works up close.

The 11th Mainland Chinese Books and Periodicals Exhibition & the Forum on Cross-strait Publications

The 11th Mainland Chinese Books and Periodical Exhibition was held from July 30 to August 15 at San Min Book Company. Directorgeneral Karl Min Ku was invited to attend the opening ceremonies. Beside speaking at the event, he also accepted a donation of books from the China National Publications Import Export Corporation, including high varied content from such publishers as the Jilin Publishing Group, Peking University Press, Xinjiang Fine Arts and Photography Publishing House, Social Sciences Academic Press, China Renmin University Press, World Publishing Corporation, China Financial and Economic Publishing House, the Ministry of Culture's Ethic Minority Folk Art Development Center, and the Zhonghua Book Company.

Following the opening ceremonies, a forum was held in the NCL on cross-strait publications. The theme was "The Displacement of Traditional Paper Publications by Digital Publications." Director-general Ku presented a copy of the "Diamond Sūtra" (published by NCL) and both a hardcopy and digital version of the "National Central Library 2009 Annual Report" to the head of the Chinese delegation Ms. Wei Wu, which corresponded with the forum's theme. Chiahong Weng, Secretary-general of the Association of Taiwan Digital Publishing Alliances, made a special point to describe the characteristics of the digital version of the "National Central Library 2009 Annual Report" in his presentation.

Digital publishing is fast becoming a major trend worldwide and publishers on both sides of the Taiwan Strait are taking an active response to related developments and issues. This new trend has started to cut the legs out from underneath traditional paper-based publications. Changes in methods of publication, avenues of sales, and reader behavior and habits all press down on tradition publishers, forcing them to find ways to adapt. This forum encouraged in-depth discussion on digital publishing related topics by publishers from both China and Taiwan. Future exchanges between both sides of the strait will be more variegated and frequent.
