



Conference for Taiwan Fellowship **Program's Visiting Scholars**

The Center for Chinese Studies and National Chengchi University's Department of History invited Daisuke Wakamatsu, doctoral student in the University of Tokyo Regional Cultural Studies Department, to speak on "Change and consistency in 21st century official Taiwan historical narratives: how far back can 'The Republic of China' be traced?" at NCU's Department of History conference room. Director of NCU's history department Lu Shao-li hosted the lecture.

The Center for Chinese Studies and Soochow University's Human Rights Program invited National University of Singapore East Asian Studies doctoral candidate Liang Jia-en to speak on "Human rights in Taiwan as a marker of national identity: a preliminary look at similarities and differences in the practice of human rights in the East Asia and Southeast Asia" at SCU. Professor Mab Huang from the Human Rights Program hosted the lecture. Liang spoke on how human rights became a popular discussion topic in Taiwan. A comparison was made between Taiwan's experience and that of other Southeast Asian countries. A survey was also made of current alternative history books from these countries. Liang also discussed how Taiwan's experience in the development of human rights and democracy can become in important lesson and beginning for other Southeast Asian countries' historical narrative, especially as it pertains to human rights issues.

The Center for Chinese Studies and National Taiwan University's Department of History invited Universidad de Buenos Aires professor Veronica Noelia Flores to speak on "China's quest for modernity: a critical review of its philosophical and cultural backgrounds in the early twentieth century (1905-1919)." Professor Wang Yann-iee from NTU's Department of History hosted the lecture. Flores argued that a common theoretical framework to define modernity was built during
